Biographical Sketch of Most Excellence Companion Anthony C. Schwab, 2010-2011

Anthony Charles Schwab was born on February 17, 1943 at Arlington, Washington to Marguerite Edna and Charles Anthony Schwab, the fourth child. His brother, Charles A. had died before he was born. He lived on a farm in the Stanwood area until he was eight years old when the whole family moved to Everett in 1951 to get away from milking the cows every day. He graduated from Everett High School in June 1961. He started going to Everett Community College right after High School but found that he needed something more. He went into the USAF on March 23, 1962 so that he could go to Vietnam. In the USAF he served four years and was Honorable Discharged on March 22, 1966. His duty stations were in Texas, Mississippi, California and Michigan. His duties in the USAF were working with radar and aircraft repair. While stationed in Michigan he came back to Everett to marry his sweetheart, Jerrolyne Jene Wood on June 12, 1964. The Ceremony was done on Paine Field AFB by an Air Force Chaplain. They have four children: Charles, Jerrolyne, Jacquelynne and Anthony. (Eight Grand Children) After leaving the USAF they moved to Everett. In June of 1971 he graduated from Everett Community College with an Associate Degree in Pre-Law. In June 1974 he graduated from Seattle Pacific with a BA in History with minors in Education and Business. He started his working career at fourteen when he started working for the Seattle PI Newspaper as a News paperboy. He became assistant manager within the five years of work at the Everett Office. He joined the USAF in March 23, 1962 thinking that Vietnam was going to be his first duty station. After training he was sent to California and then Michigan. After being discharged he started working for the Great Northern RR, because of a love for trains. Later he joined the Law Enforcement Community as a Snohomish County Deputy Sheriff on July 7, 1966. While he worked at the Sheriff Office he took fourteen years of evenings and weekends to be an advisor to the Explorer Post #007. He retired from Snohomish County Sheriff Office as a supervisor on July 6, 1986. He worked at Alderwood Mall and Northgate Mall as Security Manager for six years. He worked for Intermec for four years. In 1994 he started working for the USPS in Everett as a Letter Carrier.

Masonic Biography:

On February 8, 1979, Anthony became an Entered Apprentice, a Fellowcraft on March 8, 1979 and Master Mason on April 12, 1979 in Peninsular #95 in Everett. On May 10, 1979, MIC Anthony proved up

on the Master Mason Degree and started working in the chairs as Stewart. He became Worshipful Master of Peninsular Lodge #95 in December 1983. He was elected Master again in 1991 & 1999. He now serves his Lodge as Treasurer.

In December 1979 he and his wife joined Everett Court #7 Order of the Amaranth where they became Royal Matron & Royal Patron in December of 1983 the first time. He has been a Royal Patron 11 times for Everett Court #7. He now serves as Associate Patron. In March 1996 he became Grand Royal Patron of the Grand Court Order of the Amaranth. He now serves as a Deputy Supreme Royal Patron for Supreme Council, Order of the Amaranth, Inc.

February 1980 he joined Everett Valley of Scottish Rite where he has been Master of all the bodies, Degree Master of the 32nd Degree, Degree Master of the 13th Degree, Chaplain in the Rose Croix Funeral Team, Secretary and Treasurer. On November 3, 2001 in Portland, Oregon he received his 33 Degree from the Supreme Council of the Southern Jurisdiction of the US Scottish Rite Mason.

He started working with the International Order of Job's Daughters in 1980, when his two daughters, Jerrolynn and Jacquelynn, joined. He was appointed as Associate Bethel Guardian and served for three years. He continued to work with the Girls by being on their board. He has served as Associate Bethel Guardian with his wife as Guardian. He has served Bethel #24 in Everett for five terms as Associate Bethel Guardian and served on the board for many years. In 2001 he was given an Honorary Membership in Bethel # 24 I.O.J.D. In May 2002 he was again appointed as Associate Bethel Guardian of Bethel #24. In June of 2009 he was appointed Associate Bethel Guardian of Bethel #5 in Edmonds.

In 1987 he started working with the International Order of Rainbow for Girls where he was a Rainbow Dad for the first time. He has been Rainbow Dad for seven terms and has been on their advisory board.

In 1990 he joined the Shrine at Nile Temple in Edmonds. A few days later he joined Law Enforcement Unit and Snohomish County Shrine Club in Everett. He became President of Snohomish County Shrine Club in 1993. He serves as Secretary/Treasurer of the Shrine Club until their Charter was taken by Nile in 2009.

He joined Everett Chapter #24 Royal Arch Masons in 1988. He has been High Priest of Everett Chapter #24 three times which is now called Snohomish County #15. He joined in Everett Council #8 in 1991 and served as Illustrious Master in 1992. He joined in Palestine Commandery in 1991 and served as Commander in 1994. He is a

member of Research Chapter #68 RAM. He now serves all these bodies as Treasurer.

He has served Grand Council as Grand Illustrious Master in 2001 - 2002.

He has served as Grand High Priest in 2010-2011.

He served Grand Commandery as Deputy Instructor for two years in 1997-1999. He served Grand Chapter as Grand Principal Sojourner in 1991 - 1992.

EDITS

September 6, 2010 - Granted Enumclaw Chapter # 42 in Enumclaw that all fines for not completing their annual returns on time due to the death of their secretary and the replacement secretary not taking office be waved for the last two years. Also that the Grand Secretary was satisfied with the annual report. The reports were done and the fine would have caused the Chapter to become broke.

SEC. 287 . The annual report shall be completed and forwarded with the Grand Chapter per capita tax to the Grand Secretary not later than the first day of March yearly. Each Chapter shall be fined five dollars per day for reports submitted after the first day of March. Any or all chapter representatives who do not submit their annual report may be debarred from all privileges of the Grand Chapter. Furthermore, a chapter's charter may be forfeited by vote of the Grand Chapter.

March 15, 2011 - Appointed EC Delmer T. "Bud" Robinson as Emeritus Grand Chaplain status, effective on March 15, 2011 (2541 A.Inv.), with all the rights and privileges thereto appertaining.

CLOSING

In these troubled times we must come together and work together with our Brothers. We must work together to solve the problems that confront us. We must also work together to regain the public's faith and trust in the Masonic Order. The Masonic Order is no different than any other service type organization and would not exist without the public's faith and trust. This is not a time for blame and criticism as to why our organizations are not growing. This is a time for a cooperative effort to meet a challenge. A challenge that concerns and effects all of us. That challenge is membership.

Our conduct requires that all members of the Craft avoid any action which - might result in, or even create the appearance of misconduct which would affect the confidence of the general public in the integrity of the Masonic Bodies. In addition, all of us are expected to conduct ourselves during meetings and outside of meetings in a manner that reflects favorably upon all Bodies of the Craft.

Lastly, we as Masons are expected to be loyal to the Craft and uphold the By-Laws and customs of the Craft.

Rumors and negative comments can contribute to the tension that some Masons are already feeling.

I hope you will join me in helping our members deal with their concerns. I also hope that you will join me in providing to our members and the general public our best foot forward, discouraging negative images or statements of the Masonic Order. Companions we will have started a man of character on the path to not only Masonry but also after receiving the first three degrees the path to find that which laid buried in the rubble of the temple until the erection of the second temple at Jerusalem.

Finally companions thank you again for your continued support and confidence in me. I am truly humbled to be your Grand Scribe and pray that I have lived up to the confidence placed by you in me.

REPORT OF THE GRAND SECRETARY

2011

To the companions of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Washington

This has been a spring to not repeat on a regular interval. Masonry is a welcome refuge from some of the other problems that seem to appear out of nowhere. However not everything in Masonry is smooth and without complications. How many edicts can be issued in such a short period of time.

Chapter management has come to the forefront for a Chapter or two. It's interesting that there isn't a York Rite Organization. There is as you know three York Rite bodies but no parent. The problem that has come to the attention of a number of companions is that of commingling of funds by three separate bodies. What happens when one of the three bodies loses recognition? Someone is going to be looking to claim the assets of the defunct organization which is going to result in the accounts of all three bodies being frozen until an audit has been finished – two or three months.

Chapter Secretaries have received a copy of their membership data that is in the Grand Chapter Data Base. The objective is to have the records of the Chapter match those on the data base. The question is always what happened to the Companion that used to be on your roles. If the records can't be matched up the annual return will have the number that is on the Grand Chapter data base.

Several of the Chapters have been submitting quarterly reports, which is a great help in getting the new Companions into the system. When submitting data on someone please include the full name, contact information including e-mail addresses, phone numbers, dates of degrees.

Reports and other submittals to this office and the Focus came in slowly and not on time. Other submittals required for the Grand Session were also slow to arrive. When meetings were arranged so information and records could be reviewed and exchanged, that they were overlooked because it is too far to drive or too much trouble. Rather than communicating to get the required information it appears it is easier to "hope" the "missing" data will appear; as it would have if the arranged meeting had taken place. I am sorry but when a recommended tool is being used please recognize it.

I really can't say too loudly or strongly that clean, clear communication is essential for an organization such as ours. If you are the Chairman of a Committee it is your job to bring people together; not wait for others to do the job without you.

Whereas, It has pleased our Heavenly Father, in His infinite wisdom, to remove from amongst us our esteemed Most Excellent Companion and fellow member, **Herbert Jay Miller** born August 18, 1929 in Seattle, Washington who passed from this life April 24, 2011 in Des Moines, Washington and

Herbert Jay Miller was born August 18, 1929, in Seattle, King County, Washington. He was the eldest of two boys born to Herbert H. Miller and Dorothy H, (Mitchell) Miller. His father and mother were residents of the Masonic Home of Washington in their later years, his brother Jack R. Miller and wife Audrey reside in Claremont, California. Herb attended Mt. View Grade School in White Center and Highline High School in Burien. He was active in Boy Scouts, Troop 399, Mt. View, attending the rank of Eagle Scout in 1946. Herb joined Highline DeMolay in 1946 and was active until graduation, receiving his majority in 1950.

Subsequent to graduation from High School in 1947, Herb enlisted in the U.S. Navy. Following boot camp training in San Diego, he was assigned to the Electronics Material School, Treasure Island, San Francisco, After graduation in January 1949, Herb was assigned to the Fleet All Weather Training Unit, Barbers Point Naval Station, Oahu, Hawaii, During his assignment in Hawaii, he demitted from Highline DeMolay and affiliated to Honolulu DeMolay, serving in Preceptor Offices.

Completing his enlistment, he was discharged in July 1950 as an Electronic Technician 3rd Class Petty Officer. In September 1950, Herb enrolled at Washington State College in Pullman to continue his education. He graduated in June 1954 with a BS Degree in Electrical Engineering. While living in Pullman, he petitioned Whitman Lodge, No, 49, F. &A.M. Grand High Priest 1978 - 79

It is said that if there is a beginning there is an end. I guess that is true especially as to life. Well, we were not at the beginning of Ted's life, but we were respectfully near him when he was called to that House Not Made With Hands on January 27, 2011

Ted was born to Sam and Elsie Fonis on July 23, 1922 in Seattle, Washington. Ted had one sister, Ellen. Both his parents and sister have long ago passed away. Ted met his future bride, Betty Lou, early in 1959 and they were wed in July of 1959. From this marriage they became the proud parents of their daughter, Deborah Lou. That completed the family ... But wait-- In later years he adopted a little dog and we all have heard of Coco.

Ted attended schooling in the Seattle area, yet he continued to pursue knowledge wherever life's path found him to be even as far south as San Pedro, California.

Ted, gazing out to sea, wondered what was on the other side; so to find out, he joined the Navy in 1940. He served his active Navy duty mostly aboard two Navy ships. Completing six years of active duty, he was honorably discharged as a First Class Torpedo man Technician on July 21, 1946. He continued serving his Country by joining the Naval Reserve for a number of years. After being discharged, he moved to Wyoming and spent near four years working in various coal mines. After having enough of that, he came back to Seattle. He then applied to take the examination to become a Police Officer in Seattle. He was accepted. He served the Seattle Police Department as a Patrolman, a Detective in the Homicide Unit and as a Detective in the Narcotic Unit. And, of course, wherever the call of duty sounded.

His going to work for the Seattle Police was good luck for us, for there he met and associated with fellow Officers who were Masons. He admired their conduct and inquired as to their being and they all responded---The Masons----Well, it wasn't long before Ted applied for membership in Rainier Lodge No. 189 where he was elected to receive the degrees on June 5th, 1958. He was raised a Master Mason on September 18, 1958. Proving up in open Lodge on October 2, 1958, he thereupon started his Masonic Journey.

Ted, wanting more Light in Masonry, petitioned Rainier Chapter No 52, Royal Arch Masons, thus starting his York Rite experience taking the Royal Arch Degree on March 23, 1959. He completed his York

Rite travels, applying for and receiving membership in the Council and Commandery, finishing up those teachings in 1964. Ted was active in most Masonic Bodies but especially the Royal Arch. He contributed his talents on most every Grand Chapter Committee; the Heart Fund, the By-Laws, the Board of General Purposes, the Holy Order of High Priesthood, as Grand Master of one of the Veils, participating on Installing teams, serving as Deputy of the Grand High Priest only to name a few, and all while serving in all but one position in his Chapter.

The Companions, feeling his devotion to our craft and witnessing his talents, elected him Grand Scribe in 1973. He went on to triumphally serve as our Grand High Priest. After serving in that position, he continued to be of service to any who asked.

Ted lost his love of life, Betty Lou, due to an uncontrolled health condition which left Ted with a feeling of no hope for any healing of his broken heart. Ted tended to be a bit stubborn, that is, when his mind was made up only plausible reasoning would change his opinion and cause him to agree. Many of his Brothers visited him and his daughter, her own heart weeping at the loss of her mother, spent time assuring her dad time will heal and advising him to attend to his own health. All to but little avail. His Chapter held a special gathering to present Ted with a fifty-year pin at the proper time in his history. A large number of Companions gathered for the occasion with the Grand High Priest applying the fifty-year pin on his lapel. All together, those acts were a healing for Ted and he finally responded somewhat with an attitude of hope. The Companion's prayers were being answered. Also his Lodge, Rainier No. 189, presented him with his 50-year pin while he was in Stevens Hospital. There were six Brothers present for this ceremony.

Ted was a Member or Plural Member of several Masonic Bodies. He was a member of King Solomon Chapter in British Columbia, as he was the Representative of the Grand Chapter of British Columbia near the Grand Chapter of Washington; an active member of Nile Shrine, involved in several activities of that Masonic Group; the Allied Masonic Degrees; and so many more as the list goes on. His activities never seemed to "Run Dry."

At his Tribute Gathering, held at the Nile Center in Shoreline, the Seattle Police Officers Guild, the VFW, the U.S. Navy, a Color Guard, the Gun Salute group, and our own MEC Dick Dickason, all taking part in the Ceremony. The affair was witnessed by many Masons, including the Grand Master of the Grand Lodge, the Grand High Priest, the Grand Master of the Council plus many Past Grand Officers, most of who had Ted on some sort of detail. All plus so many more Brothers and Companions. , Many ladies attended. They all took part in

saluting Ted's contribution to our Society.

Part of his last message was...

" I thank you for the love you each have shown,
but now it's time I travel alone."

It was as though we all escorted Ted to the door of the Great Beyond
leaving him with a thanks for a job well done...

FIRST REPORT OF THE JURISPRUDENCE COMMITTEE

We your Committee on Jurisprudence have received the packet from the Grand Secretary of those items to be brought before the Companions of this Grand Chapter, including the submitted Resolutions. We will endeavor to examine and comments on each of the items submitted for an interpretation and their legality.

The first item to be considered is an "undated" proposal to change the Ritual. Submitted by three Companions of Triple Tau Chapter No. 66. The intent of this proposal is to allow the Masters of the Veil chairs face south instead of facing east. It is the opinion of the this Committee that this proposal is OUT OF ORDER. It should be rewritten and submitted to the Board of General Purposes for their review and comments, and subsequently be submitted to the votary of the Grand Chapter as a Resolution.

RESOLUTION 2011-01

Purpose: To change Organist to Musician. Resolution is in proper form for consideration. Section 15 requires a 90% vote for passage.

RESOLUTION 2011-02

Purpose: Registration Fee. Section 78 is clear in its intent when it states a Registration Fee is imposed on all members to cover Grand Chapter expenses, and is such as a joint contribution to the York Rite Grand Sessions. Resolution is in proper form for consideration. Section 78 requires a 90% vote for passage.

RESOLUTION 2011-03

Purpose: Proposed form for Certificate of Good Standing. Sections 136, 203, 215, 233, and 284 are explicit in determining the need for a Certificate of Good Standing which is lacking at present. Resolution is in proper form for consideration. Requires a 2/3 majority vote for passage.

RESOLUTION 2011-04

Purpose: To move Section 47 regarding the Districts of the District Deputies from the Constitution to a new Section in the By Laws. The Constitution establishes the structure of the Grand Chapter. The new Section proposed 103 is under the annual appropriations for the Finance Committee and grants the Grand High Priest authority to expend funds for emergency purposes. This Resolution is OUT OF ORDER. It is in proper form for consideration. Requires a 90% vote for passage. Jurisprudence recommends No to be adopted.

RESOLUTION 2011-05

Purpose: Change Deputies Districts Structure. Resolution is OUT OF ORDER. It would require the passage of Resolution 2011-04 to be adopted by the votary. Resolution is in proper form for consideration. Requires 2/3 vote for adoption. Jurisprudence recommends not to be adopted.

RESOLUTION 2011-06

Purpose: Change District Deputies Structure. Resolution is OUT OF ORDER. This Resolution refers again to Section 103A, unless Resolution 2011-04 if passed. We feel it is OUT OF ORDER as previously commented. Jurisprudence recommends a Committee be appointed to further study the logistics of this Resolution. Is in proper form for consideration. As a change to the By Laws would require a 2/3 majority vote for adoption. Jurisprudence recommends further study of this proposal, recommends it not be adopted.



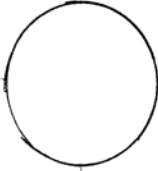

REPORT OF THE GRAND ORATOR

To the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Washington;

MAY 5, 2011**

**TO: THE MOST EXCELLENT GRAND HIGH PRIEST
AND MEMBERS OF THE
GRAND CHAPTER ROYAL ARCH MASONS
OF WASHINGTON**

This committee is pleased to report that the money brought in and paid out, with records kept in a manner that can best be described as the "Check Record Style". This style, although it accounts for the "money", it does not completely show what is required by the Section 62 of the Grand Code (Constitution, Standing Regulations & Statutes, with Digest of Edicts, Rulings and Decisions of the Most Excellent Grand Chapter Royal Arch Masons of Washington).

Examples are: The Dean Whitter account has several funds within it such as the Triennial fund, the Regalia fund and the equipment fund. These should show the accumulated amounts every year. The remainder belongs to the General Fund. A spread sheet would work for this. Also, the expenditure of the accumulated funds when needed, do not require budget approval since they are approved for that expenditure. A spread Sheet should also be prepared showing the information received from the Chapters on their annual reports. Such a spread sheet would show how many degrees each chapter had, how much they sent in for the Heart Fund and Grand Masters reception which are also not a budgeted item. The Finance Committee needs to report on this type of data and since it is not available, we do not see how the Board of General Purposes can make a "Glowing Report". It is hoped that by the time this report is due at the annual session, this committee will have been able to obtain some of the data that is missing.

Finally, it is the recommendation of the Finance Committee, that the Companion that does the Treasurer's job (or position) use an Accounting software program to keep such financial data and at the end of the fiscal year, it takes a simple click of a button to print out complete reports. One example of such is Quicken Pro (possibly a lesser version of it might also

work). Of course this should be purchased from the Grand Chapter funds.
